    - \* Elfreth's alley the oldest continuously inhabited street in America-Free
      - \* Betsy Ross house- open till 5 PM, \$8 per person
  - \*Ben Franklin Museum- Learn about Ben's life, philosophies, and inventions Open till 5 PM, \$5

    Per person
  - \* The Penn Museum- It is one of the leading archaeology and anthropology museums in the world. Open till 5 \$18 PP
  - \*Mutter Museum- this might be the best collection of medical oddities on display to the public, including such things as
  - President Grover Cleveland's tumor, an exhibition on conjoined twins, and obsolete medical instruments.

    Open till 5, \$20 PP Tickets must be Prebook a day before if interested
    - \*Philadelphia Museum of Art- The Rocky statue is also located here. open till 5, \$25 PP
    - \* Philadelphia's Magic Gardens- spans almost an entire block and engulfs everything in sight including the pathways
    - and building walls. The continuously evolving work is a colorful riot and incorporates tiles, bottles, bicycle tires, spokes; pretty much
  - anything you could think of. This is all outside Open till 6 PM, Tickets must be Prebook a day before if interested


